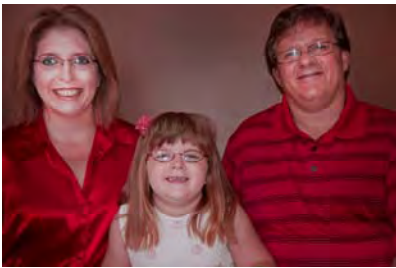

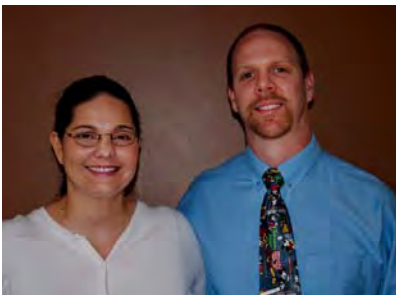
Welcome New Members

Sharing the Love of Christ in India



Last year the St. Mark Mission Committee had a remarkable visitor who shared an unforgettable story. Terri Rider, who serves in India with International Development and Education Associates (IDEAS), spoke about her ministry to the Dalit (dah-LEET) caste in India. Terri explained that the Dalits are considered “untouchable” in their country and are denied even basic medical care. She said, “We are offering the Dalits the love of Christ. We will walk alongside them to provide the much needed health and medical care they so desperately need. We will touch them and talk with them. Typically after spending time with the individual Dalits, they usually accept the One whom we represent in our work --- Jesus Christ.” The Committee and its chair at that time, Glen Keely, were so moved by Terri’s presentation that they promptly appropriated a grant for her continuing work in India.

A few months later, it was time for Glen to retire from his exceptional service as Elder Chair of the Mission Committee. Reflecting upon how impressed Glen had been by the ministry of Terri Rider, new Chair Dick Fuller and the Committee chose to make individual contributions toward a tribute gift for Glen. The money collected was forwarded to Terri’s organization with a letter explaining its significance. At the May Mission Committee meeting, members were thrilled to learn that their gift in Glen’s name had provided a very special Easter Sunday at Terri’s Dalit community church. Colorful photos show a festival worship service followed by a traditional Indian feast enjoyed by dozens of people.

Answers to Frequently Asked Questions About Stephen Ministry

What Exactly is Stephen Ministry?

Stephen Ministry is a ministry in our congregation in which trained and supervised lay persons, called Stephen Ministers, provide one-to-one Christian care to individuals facing life challenges or difficulties.

Who is Involved?

Stephen Leaders are the ones who oversee and direct our Stephen Ministry. They recruit, select, train, organize and supervise our Stephen Ministers, identify people in need of care and match them with a Stephen Minister. We have three Stephen Leaders. They are Karen Gabriel, Christy Brewer and Jean Steward.

Stephen Ministers are the caregivers. They have been through 50 hours of training in Christian caregiving, including general topics such as listening, feelings, boundaries, assertiveness and using Christian resources in caregiving. In addition, their training covered specialized topics such as ministering to the divorced, hospitalized, bereaved and aging. We currently have six active Stephen Ministers. They are Dale Birkbeck, Torrey Berger, Shirley Hillemann, Victoria Arbogast, Olivia Viehland and Debbie Hames.

What do Stephen Ministers Do?

Stephen Ministers are caring Christian friends who listen, understand, accept and pray for and with care receivers who are working through a crisis or a tough time.

Are Stephen Ministers Counselors?

Stephen Ministers are not counselors; they are trained lay caregivers. Their role is to listen and care – not to give advice or counsel. Stephen Ministers are also trained to recognize when a care receiver’s need exceeds what they can provide. When that happens they work with care receivers to help them receive the level of care they really need.

St. Mark Most Wanted

Have you driven by St. Mark at night? The beautiful cross in front of the building is lighted by a halogen light. This is the kind of lighting the Property Committee would like on the cross on the roof top. Currently, one of the lights on the roof is burned out and all three fixtures need to be replaced. This is a major job when you consider where the lights are located on the steep part of the roof. The estimated cost to replace the current roof top lighting with halogen lights is \$4000.

We have a special request for our most wanted list. The hand bells are in need of refurbishing. The Bell Choir members annually clean and polish the outside of the bells, but proper maintenance of these expensive instruments need to be done by a professional. We have a total of 40 bells and because tarnish collects on the inside of the bells, causing pitting and wear on the interior parts, they should be cleaned every few years. The last time they were cleaned was 10 years ago. The process of disassembly, cleaning and polishing, reassembly, adjusting the clapper setting and tension, and a tuning and ringing check on all of our bells is \$1750. The Bell Choir will not be practicing again until mid August so this is an ideal time to have this done.
